#### Arise, shine, for your light has come!

These opening words from the prophet Isaiah (60:1-3) hit right at the heart of Epiphany. This festival, celebrated on January 6, marks the conclusion of the Christmas season. On this day, we remember the magi—those seekers of wisdom—who followed the light of a star to worship the Christ child. The manifestation, the revealing of God incarnate, is what the word *Epiphany* means and how the day got its name.

While epiphany is not simply a singular moment, the festival of Epiphany is a single day. It ushers in a season called *the season after Epiphany*. It is not *the season of Epiphany*—a phrase that suggests it's all contained and wrapped up—but *the Sundays after Epiphany*, an ongoing movement of revelation and response. The participle **after** makes all the difference. It points us toward what flows from the light of Christ breaking into the world: a journey, a calling, and a mission to live out that light.

The Sundays after Epiphany lead us right up to Lent and give us plenty to think about as we hear about Jesus' earthly ministry. During this liturgically green season, we hear about Jesus' baptism, the calling of disciples, and Jesus' teachings and miracles. All of these moments reveal who Jesus is and what the mission is about: sharing the good news of God, calling us to live in God's light of grace and love, and showing us the joy that comes with new life in Christ.

When I gave my first children's message here at Our Saviour, the youth and I talked about the light of Christ—how it's not just for a select few, but for everyone. We're called to shine that light! The children took battery powered candles home to remind them that they have the light of Christ with them and can share it too. How can we be a light in our daily lives? How do we live out the light Isaiah speaks about during this time after Epiphany? How can we more fully shine the light to others?

Maybe the answer is as simple as remembering God loves us and the people who we encounter.

God is love incarnate! God loves you. I see God's love is a beacon of light at Our Saviour and I pray you do too. We are on the journey of discipleship always (and in the Sundays after Epiphany!). We join the mission that pushes back against the limits the world tries to put on God's ways. Jesus makes it clear that God's steadfast love is for everyone, and the light shines into even the darkest corners. God's love is universal, built into who we are. We're called to share that love, living out the grace and truth of Jesus every day.

Just as the magi followed the star, we're called to follow Jesus' light and be light for others. Jesus says in Matthew 5:14-16, "You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hidden." The themes of the season after Epiphanyrevelation, light, and discipleship-set us up for what's ahead. As we move through these weeks, we're reminded that God's love isn't stuck in the past or confined to certain places. It's alive and active, reaching out to us in Jesus and inviting us to live as disciples. So let's fix our eyes on Jesus and let the light shine through us as an Epiphany (manifestation! revelation!) of God's love.

# COMMEMORATION PROFILES

Ruth Nicholson

The Lutheran Church, as part of its worship, celebrates the lives of notable Christians of the past. Our hymnal provides a calendar (pp. 15–17) for us to follow which recognizes these individuals on the anniversary of their deaths.



#### February 3 Ansgar, Bishop of Hamburg, Missionary to Denmark and Sweden (801-865)

Ansgar was born near Amiens, France. After his mother's early death, he was sent to join a monastery. In his subsequent life as a monk, Ansgar became the first Christian missionary to Scandinavia. His appointment as an archbishop gave him much-needed funding and a base of operations for his difficult work. Just before his death, Ansgar asked his friends not to abandon the mission to the Nordic countries, but two centuries passed before Christianity was able to gain ground there. Today's Swedish Lutherans, in particular, hold Ansgar in high regard.

#### February 5 The Martyrs of Japan (died 1597)

Catholic, Episcopal, and Lutheran churches have chosen to remember, each February fifth, the crucifixion of twenty-six Christians in Nagasaki, Japan. These sixteenthcentury men of faith were six Franciscan missionaries sent from Europe, a Japanese Jesuit priest, a Korean layman, fifteen Japanese laymen, and three young boys. Despite the virtual banishment of Christianity from Japan by 1630. missionaries who entered the country in the mid-1800s found a community of Christians there that had survived by hiding its faith and worship.

#### February 23 Polycarp, Bishop of Smyrna, Martyr (c. 69-156)

Polycarp, long-lived Christian bishop of western Asia Minor, was a link between the world of the Apostles and the second -century church. It is said that he knew John, the author of Revelation, and we know that Irenaeus and Ignatius, pillars of second-century Christendom, were acquainted with him. At age eighty-six, Polycarp was arrested and ordered to renounce his faith or be killed. Unwilling to do the former, he was burned at the stake
